Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Missouri had its beginnings in 1936 when Group Hospital Service was chartered. The company was organized by civic, hospital, and medical leaders in St. Louis in order to provide prepaid hospital care for people at an affordable cost. It was renamed Blue Cross Hospital Service and on October 31, 1987, merged with Missouri Medical Service (Blue Shield) to become Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Missouri. The corporation is still operated as a not-for-profit organization and is directed by a 28-member board of trustees and an 82-member corporate assembly of business, labor, civic, hospital and medical representatives from throughout its Missouri service area, which covers St. Louis and 84 counties. The President and CEO is Roy R. Heimburger.

Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Missouri is a \$500 million-per-year health services corporation employing some 1,400 people at the St. Louis corporate headquarters at 4444 Forest Park Blvd. and its branch offices in Jefferson City, Springfield, Cape Girardeau, and Kansas City. The company is Missouri's largest health care insurer, with more than 1,200,000 member clients.

The BCBSMO corporate library is located on the sixth floor of the Forest Park headquarters building, where it moved in September 1976. The library was founded in 1969 when Blue Cross was located at 1430 Olive Street. Mary Hebert has served as corporate librarian from the beginning and has been responsible for overseeing the library's growth and development over the past 20 years. Howard Miller has served as assistant librarian since October 1987.

As far as we know, the BCBSNO library is the only insurance library in the St. Louis area and possibly in the entire state. The collection consists of 5,000 volumes, newsclippings, pamphlets, nine vertical file drawers and over 200 periodical subscriptions covering such subjects fields as insurance, health and medical sciences, business, and management. The book collection is cataloged under the Dewey Decimal System. We are building a collection of audio cassettes, mainly in the area of business and management.

Although not yet fully automated, the library does have an IBM PC and makes use of software such as "The Assistant" (Library Automation Products) for serials control; "Displaywrite III" for word processing, and "Artfile" for the indexing of the Daily News Clippings which the library compiles and distributes

to key personnel.

The BCBSMO library is open M-F, 8:15 am-5 pm to serve the information needs of the company's employees. Mary and Howard are happy to share resources through ILL to other libraries in the region. We look forward to a continuing growth of the collection and increasing use by staff and management of BCBSMO, as well as more use of automation products.

AUTOMATION WORKSHOP

A workshop for the computer novice will be presented by the St. Louis Regional Library Network. It will include hands-on work with Bibliofile (cataloging), work with MCAT (Missouri state catalog), work with several magazine databases. All of these programs run on a PC with a CD-ROM drive. Depending on the number of registrations, we may run two separate workshops. If we run two workshops, we will devide participants by type of library; the second workshop will be held on March 16, 1990 and will be for academic and special libraries. The workshop on the 15th would then be for school and public libraries.
