MLC scores big!

The Municipal Library Cooperative (MLC) was originally organized in 1967. It is made up of nine public libraries located in St. Louis County. These independent libraries serve the cities of Brentwood, Ferguson, Kirkwood, Maplewood, Richmond Heights, Rock Hill, University City, Valley Park and Webster Groves. The combined population is 160,000.

These libraries provide the communities they serve will all the advantages of small public libraries such as personal attention for patrons and collections developed for specific communities. Through MLC these libraries can also provide some of the advantages offered by larger library systems such as access to an expanded book collection and support networks for professional staff.

MLC libraries jointly maintain an interlibrary loan office located at Kirkwood Public Library. This office keeps a union list of the members holdings and communicates loan requests between them. It also processes requests to St. Louis County Library and through OCLC. Each year about 5,000 requests are filled.

Reciprocal borrowing among the nine libraries is also a major way resources are shared with about 22,000 loans made annually.

Each month the library directors meet to discuss issues, share information and make suggestions to solve problems. These meetings act as both professional development and morale booster. The children's librarians meet about twice a year as well. Plans are currently being made to have semiannual meetings for the reference staffs.

In 1992 MLC will celebrate its Silver Anniversary with 25 years of service to member libraries and their service areas. During its existence it has adapted to changes and proved itself a useful and durable organization. It has stood the test of time and all indications are that it will continue to do so.

Preservation Administrator

The Olin Library System of Washington University in St. Louis is seeking a creative and service-oriented individual as Preservation Librarian. The Olin Library System is engaged in a multi-year project of strengthening and expanding its collections and services to correlate with the University's program of enriched research and teaching activities. The Olin Library System consists of a large central library and eight satellite subject libraries.

This position is responsible for implementing and updating the Library's Preservation Policy and Three Year Plan and reports to the Head of Collection Development Services. The library is in its third year of a preservation grant from the Burlington Northern Foundation, and the University is a financial contributor to the Commission on Access and Preservation. Preservation unit includes 7 full time staff with responsibility for commercial binding, in-house repair, environmental monitoring, disaster preparedness, user and staff education, preventive preservation strategies and regional cooperative efforts.

Qualifications: Candidate must have an MLS from an ALA accredited library school. Supervisory experience, preferably in a research library environment; experience with automated systems; excellent communication skills; strong commitment to patron service and interinstitutional cooperation; an understanding of the information needs of a research university; and the ability to work effectively in a collegial manner in a changing environment.

Staff Development Officier

The Olin Library System of Washington University in St. Louis is seeking a talented and creative individual to direct its Staff Development Program. As an organization undergoing both change and development, the establishment of an effective training program for staff is essential. Ours will be a comprehensive, multi-year program for the Olin Library System which consists of a large central library and eight satellite subject libraries.

The Staff Development Officier is responsible for developing and coordinating the Library's staff development program, assessing needs and implementing library-wide activities to address these needs; planning, designing and conducting inhouse training programs; conducting job analyses; and evaluating program effectiveness on an ongoing basis.

Qualifications: MLS degree from ALA accredited Library School, preferred. Academic background in adult education, human resources, psychology or counseling preferred. Group training experience required. Understanding the role of the research library in higher education. Expertise in library operations; academic library experience, preferred. Strong interpersonal skills. Sensitivity and responsiveness to staff needs. Excellent oral and written communication skills.

The St. Louis Mercantile Library

The St. Louis Mercantile Library Association announces expanded hours to better serve its patrons, researchers, and downtown constituency. Effective Saturday, January 4, 1991, the Library will be open of Saturdays from 9:30 am to 3:30 pm and on Mondays from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. This adds two hours of service on saturdays and all of Monday to its current hours.

Expanded hours are a first step in the Library's effort to be responsive to the needs and schedules of its users. Business people, particularly those working downtown, will find the Monday hours more convenient for finding information, research services, and answers to questions. Writers, genealogists, scholars, and other researchers can now use the Library on Saturdays without taking time off from their regular work schedules.

"We are proud to be able to expand our hours of operation to better serve people in the St. Louis area," said Library Executive Director, Jeffrey Smith. "We want to be more service oriented than ever." The library will now be open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on weekdays and from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Saturdays. These expanded services include the John W. Barringer III National Railroad Library and the Herman T. Pott National Inland Waterways Library, as well.

The Library is open to the general public, but services such as checking out books, discounts on research time are available to members for \$25 a year.
