Waldo is off on an around-the-world hike. He's got everything he needs in his backpack and he's ready for adventure. But he has a problem — he keeps getting lost in crowds. Your job is to spot him. He's somewhere in that bunch of people at the beach. But wait, isn't that him over there on the ski lift? Or is he wandering among the animals at the safari park? Maybe he's right in front of you and you don't even know it. Just exactly where is Waldo?

That's a question you'll have to answer for yourself. But we will give you a small hint: you can begin the search in the Great Hall of Central Library, 1301 Olive Street. That's where you'll find Where's Waldo?, an exhibit based on Martin Handford's popular interactive game books. The exhibit will be on display from September18 through October 23 as part of St. Louis Public Library's 1991 Children Literature Festival.

Children of all ages will want to test their powers of observation with this giant reproduction of several of Mr. Handford's marvelous illustrations. Waldo travels



to all sorts of fascinating places, from amusement parks to zoos, from airports to department stores. But, while he's easily

identified - he always wears a stocking cap, striped shirt, backpack and glasses — he's not always easy to spot.

Where's Waldo? is on loan from the Kohl Children's Museum in Wilmette, Illinois. The exhibit is offered free of charge, but you will need to bring your sense of fun and adventure.

And keep your eyes open. You never know where Waldo might turn up!

The Ferguson Municipal Public Library was saddened by the

She began working at the Ferguson Municipal Public Library on November 15, 1982 as a part-time Library Assistant, and was subsequently promoted to full-time status as a Periodicals Assistant and later to Head of Public Services, the position which she held with the library at the time of her death. She also served as Acting Library Director on two occasions. A resident of Ferguson since 1965, she was a member of the Ferguson Historical Society and the FLIERS (Friends of the Library) in recent years.

Maplewood Public Library

Receives State Library Grants

The Maplewood Public Library has received two grants from the Missouri State Library to use for special projects. The first grant is to create a collection of recorded books on tape, the second to develop a small reference collection and place in local gathering places outside the Library.

Recorded books on audio tape are a rapidly-growing area of library service. However, the costs of acquiring these materials can be high. The State Library grant of \$1930 will enable the Maplewood Public Library to purchase a basic tape collection of around fifty titles, after which, the Library will add to the collection from its own yearly budget. The Library hopes to have this collection available to its users by the beginning of next year.

The second State Library grant of \$1200 is intended to help the Maplewood Public Library try a novel form of library service. Over one-third of Maplewood citizens have library cards: while this is an impressive figure (the national average is 15-20% of a community), it also means that two-thirds of Maplewood's citizens do not have cards. Moreover, a recent study reported that the majority of people in this country get their information needs met by one of the "3 B's": the beauty parlor, the barbershop and the bar. Accordingly, Maplewood Public Library has decided, as an alternative to the usual practice of trying to get non-users into the Library, to take the Library to the non-users. To this end, the Library will develop a core collection of reference books, including a dictionary, an almanac, a book of world records, and the like, and place these collections in the beauty parlors, barber shops and taverns of Maplewood. These collections will be installed without any obligation on part of the owners of the shops; if the materials are lost or stolen the owner will not be held responsible. Library Director Donnelly remarks :The goal of library service isn't simply to get people through the door, but to get them the information that they need. If we can give people what they need right where they are, then we have done our job." The State Library grant will pay for the books and the cases to hold them.

The grants awarded to the Maplewood Public Library were among seventy-eight projects funded by the Missouri State Library under the federal Library Services and Construction Act.
