

**“Changing The Canon of American Literature:
Deja Vu All Over Again”**

This lecture will comment on the recent changes in the authors now taught in standard college American literature courses. These changes are viewed as threatening to quality by some, but as highly constructive by others. The differences focus on issues of gender, race, and ethnicity. As a scholar and editor, Baym will provide an informed, and subjective, explanation of these developments, fitting them into an historical perspective on the teaching of American literature in schools and colleges.
