## ERACTS ABOUTI IIBREARIES *

There are more libraries in the U.S. than there are McDonald's restaurants.

More children participate in library summer reading programs than in little league baseball.

Libraries are one of the few places where a child's request for information is considered as important as an adult's.

More than 50 million elementary and secondary students use their school libraries each week.

In the last 25 years federal funding for libraries has totaled less than the cost of one air-craft carrier.

More than 14.2 million people use college and university libraries each week, more than watch the top-rated TV network.

Americans borrow more than 1.3 billion items from public libraries each year.

Research shows that spending for school library media services is the single most important factor related to student achievement.

Circulation of juvenile materials is up by $54 \%$ and adult materials by $10 \%$ in the last 10 years.

Libraries save businesses, scientists, and engineers an estimated $\$ 19$ billion a year in information research.

Libraries help businesses to flourish, doctors to heal, children to read, scientists to discover.
