Karen Jones, Library Literacy Consultant from the Missouri State Library, will share information about literacy in Missouri, how libraries fit into the literacy picture, what libraries might do to further support literacy, and some new literacy efforts in which libraries might share In spite of nearly universal schooling and a decrease in true illiteracy in the United States, the literacy demands of our society have become so high that low literacy continues to be an issue of concern. Almost everything libraries do requires literate patrons. As libraries think more and more about access, literacy is arguably the most basic access mechanism of all. In one sense libraries are in the literacy business any time their doors are open, but there are things they can choose to do to make their literacy support more intentional and purposeful. Karen will present information about literacy in Missouri, how libraries might become more active and purposeful in supporting literacy. We will also share ideas from successful literacy support efforts in Missouri libraries, get input from librarians at the meeting, and discuss issues, possibilities, and a new literacy initiative for libraries in Missouri.
